“Jimmy Carter, Citizen of the South: A Look at His Legacy”
by Kaye Minchew

The Georgia Archives Lunch & Learn presentation, “*Jimmy Carter, Citizen of the South: A Look at His Legacy*” by Kaye Minchew, will take place on-site on Friday, May 9, 2025, from noon to 1:00 p.m. at the Georgia Archives, 5800 Jonesboro Road, Morrow, GA.

This event is free and open to the public, with no registration required.

Former President Jimmy Carter, a distinguished Georgia leader and the 39th president of the United States, passed away on December 29, 2024. Born and raised in Plains, Georgia, Carter remained deeply connected to his Southern roots throughout his life and is now laid to rest in his beloved hometown. Kaye Minchew, author of *Jimmy Carter, Citizen of the South*, will honor his enduring legacy by sharing a compelling collection of photographs and oral histories that capture his life and impact.

About the Speaker

Kaye Lanning Minchew is a historian and archivist, as well as the author of *Jimmy Carter, Citizen of the South*, published by the University of Georgia Press in 2021. Her previous book, *A President in Our Midst: Franklin Delano Roosevelt in Georgia*, was published in 2016 and earned her the Georgia Author of the Year Award for History in 2017. A documentary based on this book aired on Georgia Public Television. Minchew also co-authored *Managing Local Government Archives* with John H. Slate, which received the Christine Zanotti Award from ARMA International. She serves on the Georgia Historical Records Advisory Council and has been a member of the National Historical Publications and Records Commission.
