## July 2025 Lunch & Learn Presentation The Atlanta Journal-Constitution Through the Years by Allison Schein

The Georgia Archives Lunch & Learn presentation, *The Atlanta Journal-Constitution Through the Years*, by Allison Schein, will take place on-site on Friday, July 11, 2025, from noon to 1:00 p.m. at the Georgia Archives, 5800 Jonesboro Road, Morrow, GA.

This talk will trace the remarkable evolution of one of Georgia's most influential newspapers, from its early beginnings and the historic merger of *The Atlanta Journal* and *The Atlanta Constitution* to its ongoing transformation into a modern digital news outlet. Schein will also highlight the crucial role that archives have played in preserving the paper's legacy and shaping its future. Don't miss this opportunity to explore the history of journalism in Georgia through the lens of its most prominent publication.

## **About the Speaker**

Allison Schein is the Director of Archives and Rights Management for *The Atlanta Journal-Constitution* and the former Director of Media Archives for WTTW/WFMT and the Studs Terkel Radio Archive in Chicago. She has collaborated with institutions such as the Library of Congress, the Chicago History Museum, the Chicago Public Library, and Dominican University's School of Information Studies. She earned her archivist certification in 2013 after completing her MLIS and holds a bachelor's degree in Audio Arts and Acoustics from Columbia College Chicago. Her past projects include processing the black-and-white photography archives of Johnson Publishing Company, reorganizing the library at the Arts Club of Chicago, and providing metadata support for Northwestern University Library's Digital Collections department. She is also the 2014 recipient of the Young Mazzuchelli Model Award.
